FEBRUARY SPEAKER: Steve Burrows
Topic:” From Birder to Birder Murder: The Mystery Continues”

Steve Burrows is a Canadian mystery writer, journalist and former teacher.

Steve has written 7 birder murder mystery books. His first novel, a Siege of Bitterns won the 2015 Arthur Ellis award for best first novel. Steve’s latest book, A Foreboding of Petrels has just been recently published.

As is evident from the titles of Steve’s books he is an avid bird watcher and his recent trip to the Antarctica means he has now visited 8 continents in pursuit of his interest.

Also of note, a production deal between Shaftesbury (Murdoch Mysteries) and a UK

company means that Steve’s books have been optioned for TV.

Although born in the UK (Steve immigrated to Canada after grammar school) and a world traveller, he and his wife, Resa live in Oshawa.
