As stated in the PROBUS Canada newsletter of January 2019 there were 250 active clubs in Canada (including 4 new since October 2018) with 37,600 members with the number of members increasing daily. Durham Central and Richmond Hill make the fifth and sixth new clubs added since October 2018 which, if my addition is correct, should bring the number of active Canadian clubs to 252.
