President's Message

I started my April message saying that it was now officially spring, and those big piles of snow were gone. You would not have thought that last Monday evening when old man winter gave us one last surprise. At least we didn't need to shovel it.

April was our second in-person meeting and I thank all those that attended. Still no coffee/treats or 50/50 draws but this will be discussed at the next management meeting.

Your Social Committee has been working hard to come up with some great ideas - Landmark Theatre sold out and there is a waiting list, Kawartha Downs in May for a buffet meal and then lose some money on the ponies, and Westben Theatre for an ABBA tribute in July. Sign-up sheets will be available at the May meeting.

Your Special Interest Groups are getting back together and sign-up sheets will also be available at the May meeting. Please take time to see what is available. You may find something of "special interest".

Our guest speaker in April was Andrés Jimenez. His presentation was about the joy of birds, and I found it to be very informative. Our scheduled May speaker is author Terry Fallis. Terry has spoken to us in the past and has provided interesting topics.

Those with e-mail should have received notification that we found it necessary to increase our membership fees from \$30 to \$40 starting this coming September. For those who do not have e-mail a copy of it is appended below in the newsletter. It will outline the reasons why the increase was necessary.

By now most of you are probably aware of the passing of Ron Allen, Past President, and long-time member of our PROBUS Club. Our condolences to the Allen family.

Coffee and refreshments will not be served at the May meeting so please bring your own and please wear a mask.

Please stay safe and I look forward to greeting you at our meeting May 10th.

Membership Fee Increase

After reviewing our club's current financial position, your management team has determined that it is necessary to increase the annual membership fee from the current \$30 to \$40 for each member. This fee increase will take affect at next renewal date. The current membership fee has been in effect since 2016 increasing from \$15 in 2011.

At the beginning of the COVID pandemic, the Club had sufficient funds in the bank and in 2020 - 2021 we reduced the annual membership fee to \$15. In 2021 - 2022 we forgave the membership fee. However, in both years we still had certain expenses such as insurance, software, speakers and newsletter costs that needed to be covered.

Based on what we knew at the time, I still believe reducing/forgiving the membership fees was justifiable and did not anticipate a change to the current fee. What we didn't foresee, was the Oshawa & District Shrine Club increasing our rent by \$100 per month. Our annual rent to the Oshawa & District Shrine Club is now \$4,750 including taxes.

Our financial estimates were based on 250 members. If the membership fee were to remain at \$30 per member, we would run a deficit of approximately \$1,300. (Membership fees of \$7,500 less projected expenses of \$8,770)

A membership fee of \$35 was also considered, but this would still leave us in a small deficit position.

Increasing the membership fee to \$40 will/should provide the Club with a surplus of approximately \$1,200.

Should we look for a new venue? Perhaps, but I think it would be difficult to find a suitable location that would meet the requirements of our members. We currently have ample space, more the sufficient parking and easy access for our senior members.

Please be assured approving this increase was not taken lightly and also be assured the membership fees will continue to be monitored on an annual basis and adjusted as necessary.

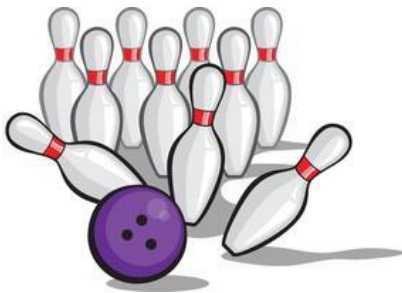

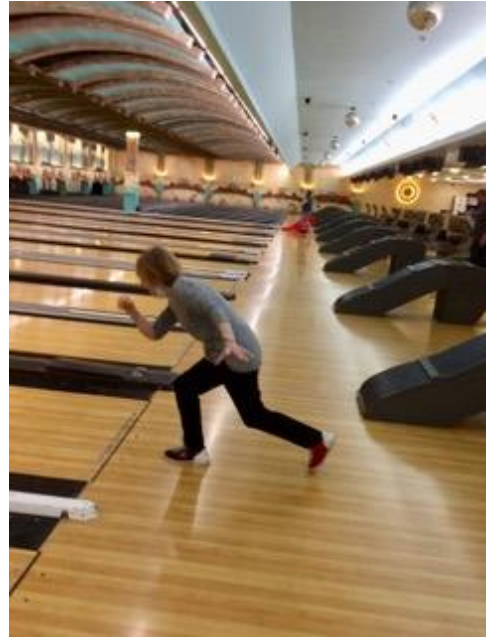
MOVIE - Downton Abbey

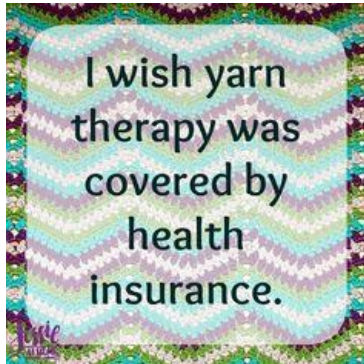
SCRABBLE – Judy Bryson
